The persecution of Christians acquired drama and unprecedented history. According to statistics, almost three hundred million Christians around the world are persecuted for their faith. Christians are the most persecuted believers in the world.

Let us pray together with you today about all the persecuted and about softening the hearts of their persecutors. May the Lord grant His peace to all who find it difficult to live in our unfree and unjust world. Let's not forget that the resurrected Jesus, as promised, is always with us. Christ is alive! Let's open our hearts to Him! We will tirelessly beg Him to give the opportunity to us to be with Him, by His love, by our faith. Let us not doubt today in the words of the Apostle Paul, that "God ... shall also raise us up by His power" (1 Corinthians 6:14).
